NSS SPECIAL CAMP

Date: 19/02/2022 to 25/02/2022

Venue: Kaiwara, Chickballapur district.

The main theme for the camp this year is to create general awareness among the people about the PULSE POLIO PROGRAM, WASTE SEGREGATION MANAGEMENT, GOVERNMENT FARMER SCHEMES, BENEFITS OF, HEALTH CENTRES and COVID VACCINATION.

DAY 1

We started our journey to Kaiwara fromcollege after a meeting that was conducted to give the agenda of the 7-day camp. After 2 hours of journey, we reached the campsite. On reaching Kaiwara we had food and arrange for the camp's inaugural program. Evening we started the inauguration function, Mr. K Lakshmi Narayan, Administrator, Kaivar Mutt was the Chief guest, our college principal Dr. Nagarathna A presided over the function, NSS program officer Mr. Surendra A S, Youth Red Cross program officer Dr. Ramakrishnaiah T N and Punchayth leaders were present in the function. NSS volunteers were motivated to give their best and also make sure we had a good time while doing the activities. After the inauguration program, we were allotted rooms and allotted awareness activities which were to be conducted and were given time to prepare the requirements for the activities.



A plastic segregation drive was done on the second day, and volunteers gathered in the morning at 5.30 am. After the prayer, students cleaned the surrounding of Kaivara mutt and moved trek to Kaiwara hill. The hill was about 4 km and the professors who guided us made sure everyone went to the top of the hill with utmost safety. While climbing the hill volunteers gathered the plastics. Even though the trek turned out tiresome it was worth the energy because the plastic segregation message was given to goers. After relaxing for some time we reached down and went to our respective rooms to freshen up. Volunteers were asked to prepare awareness material for the next day's activity in the afternoon. Students performed cultural in the evening.



DAY 3

Day 3 started with prayer in the morning at 6.00 am followed by yoga classes by Dr.Ramakrishnaiah T N, Youth Red Cross program officer, MSRCASC.

After breakfast, NSS volunteers went to a village named Mylapuralocated 6km from Kaiwara which is one of the adopted by the village in Kaivara by our college. We visited the government higher primary school of the village and taught the students about basic cleanliness and their part in maintaining the cleanliness of their surroundings. NSS volunteers distributedbasic stationeryitems to the kids. Volunteers arranged some simple games for the kids and made sure the kids had a good time. We all made sure the kids understood the purpose of the awareness activity which was conducted. The professors who assisted us

spoke to the Head Madam of the school and asked them about the requirements and told them to arrange the requirements they need in the next visit.

After the school event, we also visited the healthcare center of the village, collected information about the health schemes available, and the same was conveyed to the villagers by visiting door to door.



DAY 4

Day 4 started with a prayer followed morning walk around Kaivaralake, which offered a wonderful view, all the volunteers were really content with the way the day had begun and realized the beauty of nature.

NSS volunteers visited another school in Nagavaravillage and gave a presentation to the kids on cleanliness, the kids were so enthusiastic and talented and were keen on interacting with us. The students were given stationery items as a token of appreciation and we spoke to the headmaster of the school regarding the necessities they require and gave word to reach out to them with the requirements in the future.

After visiting the school the volunteers went around the village in different groups and asked the villagers if they have taken the Covid-19 vaccine and if there are children below 5 we informed them about the pulse polio vaccine drive by the government, which was commencing from the next week and asked them to not miss pulse polio dose for their kids. We also informed them about the schemes which the government offers to farmers and the schemes available at the local healthcare centres.





Day 5 started with the prayer in the morning followed by the march-fast practice for all the volunteers. After breakfast, all the volunteers visited an orphanage run by Kaivara mutt and interacted with the orphans.

After lunch, we went to Kailasagiri, a temple constructed with carving big rocks, a famous tourist place, and conducted a cleanliness awareness and collected the plastic items thrown by the visitors who came to visit the temple. It was sad to see the surroundings unclean but we gave our best and cleaned the surroundings. The harmful effects of unprocessed plastic were spread among visitors of the temple. This was followed by a trekking to Kailasagri temple.





Day 6 started with a prayer in the morning. As we had a plan of having awareness activities in the city of Kaiwara, all the volunteers started preparing materials for it. After breakfast, all the volunteers gathered with banners and placards. Volunteers went around the city of Kaiwarawith slogans shouting and educated the people and shopkeepers about maintaining cleanliness leads to a healthy and happy life and waste segregation is an effective way to reduce landfills. We also educated the devotees who visited the temple to not litter the place.

Evening all the students gathered in the auditorium for the talk by Mr.Anand of Kaivara mutt. He spoke about the historical importance of the place Kaivara. He also stressed on the importance and selfless service for a satisfactory peaceful life. The students involved themselves in the cultural activities after the blissful talk by Mr.Anand.



On the last day a valedictory function was arranged.
