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





Conclusion:






The date of 07th July 2023 marked the release of the Newsletter of the MBA Department of Ramaiah College of Arts, Science, and Commerce.

The speaker for the session was Dr. Vinod Vyasulu, Economist, IIMB. The topic of the session was on "Unlocking the power of Economics: Why studying economics matters in an ever-changing world".



The session started with What Economics is all about? Further, the session discussed that Economics is a study of scarcity and its implications for the use of resource, production of goods and services, growth of production and welfare overtime and a great variety of other complex issues of vital concern to society. The speaker also mentioned that Economics is mainly about production, distribution and consumption of goods.


The session also focussed on providing insights on the concept of India's National Income. The income depicts the value of goods and services which are produced by an economy. They also explained in detail that National income defines as country's wealth. This income depicts the value of goods and services which are produced by an economy. It is also considered as the sum total of the value of all the goods and services manufactured by the resident of the country in a year. The concepts of Gross Domestic Product and Gross National Product were also the part of the session.

Apart from the session also briefed out about the concept of pricing in the economy. The concept of purchasing power, inflation, market imbalances were all a part of the session. The session clearly enlightened about market and role of government in the smooth functioning of the economy. The concept of recession was also discussed, it mentioned that recession is a downward trend in the business cycle characterized by a decline in production and employment, which in turn causes the income and spending of household to decline.

The session bought in clarity among the students about the basic concepts of economics. The students were able to understand about the national income, gross domestic product and gross national product. Apart from these, it also educated them about the scenario of inflation and how it impacts the economy.


The speaker for the session was Mrs. Linda Ann John (ASTD Certified Trainer Coach). The topic of the session was "Customer Relationship Management"



- 3. Decision making in risk conditions






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






MOKSHA







Definition


Moksha also called vimoksha, vimukti and mukti is a term in Hinduism, Buddhism, Jainism and Sikhism for various forms of emancipation, enlightenment, liberation, and release. In its soteriological and eschatological senses, it refers to freedom from saṃsāra, the cycle of death and rebirth. In its epistemological and psychological senses, moksha is freedom from ignorance: self-realization, self-actualization and self-knowledge.

In Hindu traditions, moksha is a central concept and the utmost aim of human life; the other three aims being dharma (virtuous, proper, moral life), artha (material prosperity, income security, means of life), and kama (pleasure, sensuality, emotional fulfillment). Together, these four concepts are called Puruṣārtha in Hinduism.

BUDDHISM

In Buddhism the term "moksha" is uncommon, but an equivalent term is vimutti, "release". In the suttas two forms of release are mentioned, namely ceto-vimutti, "deliverance of mind," and panna-vimutti, "deliverance through wisdom" (insight). Ceto-vimutti is related to the practice of dhyana, while panna-vimutti is related to the development of insight.

Nirvana ends the cycle of Dukkha and rebirth in the six realms of Saṃsāra (Buddhism).It is part of the Four Noble Truths doctrine of Buddhism, which plays an essential role in Theravada Buddhism. Nirvana has been described in Buddhist texts in a manner similar to other Indian religions, as the state of complete liberation, enlightenment, highest happiness, bliss, fearless, freedom, dukkha-less, permanence, non-dependent origination, unfathomable, indescribable



JAINISM

As with all Indian religions, moksha is the ultimate spiritual goal in Jainism. It defines moksha as the spiritual release from all karma. Jaina traditions believe that there exist Abhavya (incapable), or a class of souls that can never attain moksha (liberation). The Abhavya state of soul is entered after an intentional and shockingly evil act, but Jaina texts also polemically applied Abhavya condition to those who belonged to a competing ancient Indian tradition called Ājīvika.

According to Jainism, purification of soul and liberation can be achieved through the path of three jewels: Samyak darśana (Correct View), meaning faith, acceptance of the truth of soul (jīva);Samyak jnana (Correct Knowledge), meaning undoubting knowledge of the tattvas; and Samyak charitra (Correct Conduct), meaning behavior consistent with the Five vows. Jain texts often add samyak tap (Correct Asceticism) as a fourth jewel, emphasizing belief in ascetic practices as the means to liberation (moksha). The four jewels are called moksha marg. According to Jain texts, the liberated pure soul (Siddha) goes up to the summit of universe (Siddhashila) and dwells there in eternal bliss.

SIKHISM

The Sikh concept of mukti is similar to other Indian religions, and refers to spiritual liberation. It is described in Sikhism as the state that breaks the cycle of rebirths. Mukti is obtained according to Sikhism, states Singha, through "God's grace". According to the Guru Granth Sahib, the devotion to God is viewed as more important than the desire for Mukti.

Sikhism recommends Naam Simran as the way to mukti, which is meditating and repeating the Naam (names of God).





HINDUISM


Ancient literature of different schools of Hinduism sometimes use different phrases for moksha. For example, Keval jnana or kaivalya ("state of Absolute"), Apavarga, Nihsreyasa, Paramapada, Brahmabhava, Brahmajnana and Brahmi sthiti. Modern literature additionally uses the Buddhist term nirvana interchangeably with moksha of Hinduism.



The six major orthodox schools of Hindu philosophy offer the following views on moksha, each for their own reasons: the Nyaya, Vaisesika and Mimamsa schools of Hinduism consider moksha as possible only after death. Samkhya and Yoga schools consider moksha as possible in this life. In the Vedanta school, the Advaita sub-school concludes moksha is possible in this life, while Dvaita, Visistadvaita, Shuddhadvait sub-schools of Vedanta tradition believes that moksha is a continuous event, one assisted by loving devotion to God, that extends from this life to post-mortem. Beyond these six orthodox schools, some heterodox schools of Hindu tradition, such as Carvaka, deny there is a soul or after life moksha.


According to Naradaparivrajaka Upanishad, the liberated individual shows attributes such as:

- He is not bothered by disrespect and endures cruel words, treats others with respect regardless of how others treat him;
- When confronted by an angry person he does not return anger, instead replies with soft and kind words;
- Even if tortured, he speaks and trusts the truth;
- He does not crave for blessings or expect praise from others;
- He never injures or harms any life or being (ahimsa), he is intent in the welfare of all beings;
- He is as comfortable being alone as in the presence of others;
- He is as comfortable with a bowl, at the foot of a tree in tattered robe without help, as when he is in a mithuna (union of mendicants), grama (village) and nagara (city);
- He doesn't care about or wear sikha (tuft of hair on the back of head for religious reasons), nor the holy thread across his body. To him, knowledge is sikha, knowledge is the holy thread, knowledge alone is supreme. Outer appearances and rituals do not matter to him, only knowledge matters;
- For him there is no invocation nor dismissal of deities, no mantra nor non-mantra, no prostrations nor worship of gods, goddess or ancestors, nothing other than knowledge of Self;
- He is humble, high-spirited, of clear and steady mind, straightforward, compassionate, patient, indifferent, courageous, speaks firmly and with sweet words.



Gajendra Moksha

The elephant Gajendra enters a lake where a crocodile (Huhu) clutches his leg and becomes his suffering. Despite his pain, Gajendra constantly remembers Vishnu, who then liberates him. Gajendra symbolically represents human beings, Huhu represents sins, and the lake is samsāra.

VAISESIKA SYSTEM


• The Vaisheshika Sutras mention the doctrines of competing schools of Indian philosophy such as Samkhya and Mimamsa, but make no mention of Buddhism, which has led scholars in more recent publications to posit estimates of 6th to 2nd century BCE.

The text states:

- There are nine constituents of realities: four classes of atoms (earth, water, light and air), space (akasha), time (kāla), direction (disha), infinity of souls (Atman), mind (manas).
- Every object of creation is made of atoms (parmanu) which in turn connect with each other to form molecules (anu). Atoms are eternal, and their combinations constitute the empirical material world.
- Individual souls are eternal and pervade material body for a time.
- There are six categories (padārtha) of experience substance, quality, activity, generality, particularity, and inherence.

AKSAPADA SYSTEM

- The Nyāya Sūtras is an ancient Indian Sanskrit text composed by Akṣapāda Gautama, and the foundational text of the Nyaya school of Hindu philosophy.
- The date when the text was composed, and the biography of its author is unknown, but variously estimated between 6th-century BCE and 2nd-century CE.
- The text may have been composed by more than one author, over a period of time.
- The text consists of five books, with two chapters in each book, with a cumulative total of 528 aphoristic sutras, about rules of reason, logic, epistemology and metaphysics.



- The Nyāya Sūtras is a Hindu text notable for focusing on knowledge and logic, and making no mention of Vedic rituals.
- The first book is structured as a general introduction and table of contents of sixteen categories of knowledge.
- Book two is about pramana (epistemology), book three is about prameya or the objects of knowledge, and the text discusses the nature of knowledge in remaining books.
- It set the foundation for Nyaya tradition of the empirical theory of validity and truth, opposing uncritical appeals to intuition or scriptural authority.

- The Nyaya sutras cover a wide range of topics, including Tarka-Vidyā, the science of debate or Vāda-Vidyā, the science of discussion.
- The Nyāya Sutras are related to but extend the Vaiśeṣika epistemological and metaphysical system.
- Later commentaries expanded, expounded and discussed Nyaya sutras, the earlier surviving commentaries being by Pakṣilasvāmin Vātsyāyana (5th-6th Century CE), followed by the Nyāyavārttika of Uddyotakāra (6th-7th Century CE), Vācaspati Miśra's Tātparyatīkā (9th Century CE), Udayana's Tātparyapariśuddhi (10th Century CE), and Jayanta's Nyāyamañjarī (10th Century CE).

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

- The Nyaya-sutras is attributed to Gautama, who was at least the principal author.
- According to Karl Potter, this name has been a very common Indian name,[16] and the author is also reverentially referred to as Gotama, Dirghatapas and Aksapada Gautama.
- Little is known about Gautama, or which century he lived in. Scholarly estimates, based on textual analysis, vary from the 6th century BCE, making him a contemporary of Gautama Buddha (Siddhartha Gautama) and Mahavira, to as late as the 2nd century CE.
- Some scholars favor the theory that the cryptic text Nyaya-sutras was expanded over time by multiple authors, with the earliest layer from about mid-first millennium BCE that was composed by Gautama.
- The earliest layer is likely to be Book 1 and 5 of the text, while Book 3 and 4 may have been added last, but this is not certain.

STRUCTURE

- The text is written in sutra genre. A sutra is a Sanskrit word that means "string, thread", and represents a condensed manual of knowledge of a specific field or school.
- Each sutra is any short rule, like a theorem distilled into few words or syllables, around which "teachings of ritual, philosophy, grammar or any field of knowledge" can be woven.
- Sutras were compiled to be remembered, used as reference and to help teach and transmit ideas from one generation to the next.
- The Nyayasutra is divided into five books, each book subdivided into two chapters each. The structure of the text is, states Potter, a layout of ahnikas or lessons served into daily portions, each portion consisting of a number of sutras or aphorisms.
- The architecture of the text is also split and collated into prakaranas or topics, which later commentators such as Vatsyayana and Vacaspati Misra used to compose their bhasya, ancient texts that have survived into the modern era.
- There are several surviving manuscripts of the Nyayasutras, with a slight difference in number of sutras, of which the Chowkhamba edition is often studied.

Presents its theory of body, followed by theory of sensory organs and their role in correct and incorrect knowledge, states that the soul is not a sense organ nor an internal organ.

Presents its theory of soul (self, atman), that the essence of a person and source of judgments is the soul, states its "judgment is non-eternal" theory, presents theory of Karma

Number of sutras- 68

Presents its theory of defects, then its theory that "everything has cause, and consequences", and its "some things are eternal, some non-eternal" theory. Defines and describes Fruits, Pain, Release.

CHAPTER-2

Number of sutras- 50

Presents correct knowledge is necessary and sufficient to destroy defects. Both whole and part must be known. Establishes external world exists, and phenomenon are as real as objects. Refutes the "everything is false" theory. Presents ways to produce and maintain correct knowledge, Need to seek and converse with those with knowledge.

CONTENT

- The first sutra 1.1.1 of the text asserts its scope and the following sixteen categories of knowledge as a means to gain competence in any field of interest:
- Perfection is attained by the correct knowledge about true nature of sixteen categories: means of right knowledge (pramāṇa); object of right knowledge (prameya); doubt (samsaya); purpose (prayojana); familiar instance (dṛṣṭānta); established tenet (siddhānta); members of an inference (avayava); reasoning (tarka); ascertainment or results (nirṇaya); discussion (vāda); sophistic disputations (jalpa); cavil (vitaṇḍa); fallacies (hetvābhāsa); quibbles (chala); futile rejoinders (jāti); and methods of losing an argument (nigrahasthāna).
- These sixteen categories cover many sections of the text.
- The verse 1.1.2 of the Nyāya Sūtra declares the text's goal is to study and describe the attainment of liberation of soul from wrong knowledge, faults and sorrow, through the application of above sixteen categories of perfecting knowledge.

COMMENTARIES

The earliest surviving complete bhasya (review and commentary) on Nyaya Sutras is by Vatsyayana. This commentary itself inspired many secondary and tertiary bhasya. Vatsyayana's commentary has been variously dated to be from the 5th century CE, or much earlier around 2nd century BCE. Another often studied surviving commentary on the text is credited to Vacaspati Mishra from about 9th century CE.

Other historical Indian commentaries and works inspired by Nyayasutras and which have survived into the modern era, include Nyaya-varttika by 6th-century Uddyotakara, Nyaya-bhasyatika by 6th-century Bhasivikta, another Nyaya-bhasyatika by 7th-century Aviddhakarna, Nyaya-bhusana by 9th-century Bhasarvajana, Nyaya-manjari by 9th-century Kashmir scholar Jayanta Bhatta, Nyaya-prakirnaka by 10th-century Karnata scholar Trilocana, and Nyaya-kandali by 10th-century Bengal scholar Sridhara.



Introduction

The "Mobile Application Development" workshop was conducted on 2nd February 2023 by Mr. Aurangjeb Khan, at Ms Ramaiah College Of Arts Science & Commerce. The workshop was designed to help students to create dynamic interfaces for web applications. Around 60 participants from the department of BCA attended the workshop.

Background Information

Mobile app development is rapidly growing in many organizations across industries. The workshop is aimed to help the students acquire the skills and knowledge needed to build a mobile application with emerging technologies.

Objectives

The main objectives of the workshop were to:

- Practical experience of creating a mobile application
- Installing and running a webpage for the app using 2 types of codes
- Creating own applications on AVD
- Designing the application

Methodology

The workshop consisted of a combination of presentations, discussions and hands on experience for designing a mobile application. Students worked individually and in teams on



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their systems to install and run AVD (Android Virtual Design) in session 1 and designing of the application using Java and XML code was done in the second session.

Steps of downloading Android Studio, choosing the version of android accordingly were taught and executed. During the installation process, there was a discussion on the types of Mobile Applications-Native, Hybrid and Web. Native application development was being carried out. Software and the emulator installation was done, after which AVD's creation to build a potential application that could be on the PlayStore.

Different platforms of Operating Systems, it's platforms and Android Versions history (upto the latest existing version) were conceptualised.

Designing of Applications using XML and Java programming languages was introduced. Relevant usage of the codes were done, based on the layout and overall design of the application.

The workshop facilitator also discussed about data persistence, for real time applications.

Outcome

The workshop was well received and taught basics of building a mobile application using Android Studio. Discussions on OHA (Open Handset Alliance) Smartphone Platform market share and Categories/Areas of designing applications were held. A practical experience of Native Android Application Development was achieved.

Conclusion

The workshop provided a valuable opportunity for participants to learn about the working of mobile application development, it's implementation and how it's designed with the help of front end and back end coding.

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




